TOURNAMENT DIRECTOR'S CORNER

It has been a great two years and I've enjoyed getting to know you, personally. It's not easy stepping aside, but what a relief. This position is very time consuming and my greatgranddaughter, now seven, has visited me for the last two summers, who told me that I should just let the phone ring, turn off the computer and spend more time with her. This I will be able to do next summer when she visits.

First time members: we will have a lot of new members playing in tournaments. Please be patient and assist them with their personal score sheet as far as table rotation. Explain the basic rules when you first sit at the table; things like bidding out of turn, not declaring aces, no card or too many cards at the end of play. Hopefully, the rules are explained to new members when they join a club. Someone in the club should take the initiative to make sure they know the rules.

Penalties: will be strictly enforced as far as tardiness. Points will be deducted, no exceptions. We need to act like responsible adults and be in our seats.

Courtesies; don't stand over people when waiting for your table, and move to your next table, don't take a twenty-minute smoke break. If you must leave, leave your name tag and get back quick.

Tournament Committee Meeting; I encourage all first time members to attend and to take the "Referee traininglcertification.

Don't interrupt the scorekeeper, if there's a problem with your score bring it to the attention of one of the verifiers. It is the responsibility of each person at the table to make sure names/#s are correct as well as the score. If you don't like the way the cards are shuffled, ask that they be reshuffled. If you don't like the referee's decision, ask for another one, don't complain afterwards. Please keep the playing area clean by putting trash in the trash receptacles.

Outside food is not allowed in the hotel; you must take it to

your ROOM, not the playing area. No alcohol can be brought into the playing area or any other areas of the hotel, only in your ROOM.

It has been a great privilege serving as NPA Tournament Director for the past two years and I will gladly miss it and all of you, but I'm just a phone call away.

Thanks, and look forward to seeing you in New Orleans.


