HEALTH TIPS

November 1st-30th is National Diabetes Awareness Month.

Q: What is diabetes?

A: Diabetes is a group of metabolic diseases where the body's pancreas does not produce enough insulin or does not properly respond to insulin produced, resulting in high blood sugar levels over a prolonged period. There are several different types of diabetes, but the most common forms are type 1 and type 2 diabetes. Both impact glucose levels, and if left untreated, can cause many complications.

Q: What is type 1 diabetes

A: Type1diabetes (T1D) can occur at any age, but is most commonly diagnosed from infancy to late 30s. If a person is diagnosed with type 1 diabetes, their pancreas produces little to no insulin, and the body's immune system destroys the insulin-producing cells in the pancreas.

Those diagnosed with type 1 diabetes must inject insulin several times every day or continually infuse insulin through a pump, as well as manage their diet and exercise habits.

Q: What is type 2 diabetes?

A: Type 2 diabetes (T2D) typically develops after age 40, • but has recently begun to appear with more frequency in children." If a person is diagnosed with type 2 diabetes, their pancreas still produces insulin, but the body does not produce enough of is not able to use it effectively. Those diagnosed with type 2 diabetes manage their disease through a combination of treatments, including diet control, exercise, self-monitoring of blood glucose, and in some cases, oral drugs or insulin.

Q: What causes diabetes?

A: Researchers are still trying to get a clear picture of what causes diabetes—they've found that genes don't tell the whole story, and that environmental factors also play a role. There is also a misconception that the cause of diabetes is hereditary, and primarily occurs in families where there is someone else with diabetes. Research has shown that only 15 percent of people with type 1 diabetes have an affected first-degree relative.

Q: What are the symptoms of diabetes?

A: Knowing the warning signs for diabetes could help save a life! Type 1& 2 diabetes can often go undiagnosed in its early stages because the symptoms can be mistaken for more common illnesses, like the flu. Take notice if you or your loved one experiences the following:

Extreme thirst

Frequent urination

Drowsiness and lethargy

Sugar in urine

Sudden vision changes

Increased appetite

Sudden weight loss

Fruity, sweet, or wine-like odor on breath

Heavy, labored breathing, stupor or unconsciousness

Call your doctor immediately if one or more of these symptoms occurs in you or your loved one. It is extremely important to receive medical attention—misdiagnosis or leaving your condition untreated can have tragic consequences, including death.

BYLAWS

Bylaws are a standing set of rules that govern the regulation of the internal affairs of a corporation or society. As we continue to look at the NPA bylaws, the hope is that all our members will know and understand how this organization works. The Bylaws and the NPA handbook can be found on the NPA website.

ARTICLE III-NPA ORGANIZATION-CHAPTERS

NPA

The Officers, Board of Directors, Executive Committee, Affiliated Chapters, Standing Committees, Special Committees, and individual members of the NPA shall perform representative, legislative, executive, administrative and or supervisory activities in order to carry out their respective duties and responsibilities for the benefit of the organization.

The Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make disbursements and distributions in furtherance of the purpose set forth in Article II. No part of the gross earnings of NPA shall inure to any of its members, directors, and/ or officers.

The Officers, Board of Directors, Executive Committee, Affiliated Chapters, committees, or members, shall not in the name of NPA, propagandize, attempt to influence legislation, participate in any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office (including the publishing or distribution of statements), nor be a party to any activity impermissible to a corporation exempt from federal income tax under any Internal Revenue regulations or by a corporation.

Chapters

NPA may certify as a Chapter any Pinochle organization

composed of (4) or more individuals. A majority vote of the Board of Directors is required for approval. The Corresponding Secretary or the Membership Committee of NPA shall issue a Certificate of Membership to each organization approved as a Chapter.

The certificate shall continue in force until revoked for just cause as determined by majority vote of the Board of Directors or withdraw by the Chapter.
Chapters shall not enact Bylaws or rules that in any way conflict with NPA Bylaws or rules.
