WASHINGTON D.C., THE CITY OF UNIVERSAL CULTURE AND EDUCATION By Doc Raiford

Washington, D.C., is much more than the Nation's Capital. In fact, that is probably the least of its attraction for me. The city is a virtual university, and one that is essentially FREE. Here is a very short list of all the great treasures you will find in DC:

THE NATIONAL ARCHIVES: This museum houses millions of original historical documents. It is the permanent home of the U.S. Constitution. The Declaration of Independence, the Bill of Rights, and the **Emancipation Proclamation.**

THE MUSEUM OF AIR AND **SPACE:** This is probably the most visited museum in the world. There is so much to see and do there that even a full day will not be enough time. The vehicles that were sent to the moon and back are there, as well as specimens that were brought back from out of space. The interactive history of air travel and space exploration is so fascinating.

THE LIBRARY OF CONGRESS: This library has a copy of every book and pamphlet that has ever been copyrighted in the United States. Library cards are free to all American citizens and you will find extremely helpful librarians available to assist.

THE AFRICAN AMERICAN **MUSEUM OF CULTURE AND HISTORY: This museum, alone,** is worth the visit to DC. It is so popular, that you need timesensitive tickets for admission. The tickets are free, but you must order them ahead. To really see the museum, you will need more than one day.

THE NATIONAL CATHEDRAL: This is the second largest church in the U.S. and can accommodate more than 3000 people. (This is where McCain's D.C. funeral was held.) It is one of the most impressive religious structure in the world, right behind the Vatican and St. John **Devine in New York.**

THE FREDERICK DOUGLASS **HOUSE:** To really understand the significance of Mr. Douglass, you must find time to visit his very impressive home and be escorted through it by a U.S. Park Ranger. Don't miss the introductory movie which dramatizes his life from slavery to U.S. Marshall.

Finally, there are more than a half dozen NPA chapters in the DC area; all very active - with practically weekly minitournaments!

I am a new resident in D.C, and I'm loving it!
